By 2024 it is anticipated that electric passenger UAM aircrafts will be a reality and that Canada may be an early adopter of this new way of transport, due to its geography of dense cities and remote rural areas.

Local governments recognise the unique needs of their communities but in order to make the UAM ecosystem a reality they need collaboration from industry experts and researchers to manage public acceptance and implementation. With the support of Solvay and other members, CAAM's 2040 long term goal is to ensure that 1 in 5 aircraft operating throughout Canada will be emission free.
